

Cornwall Gardens Trust
Application Guidelines for Secondary Schools and other education

The aim of our grants is to: encourage young people, aged 12-19, to take an active role in the development and maintenance of garden areas. Such areas could be within school grounds or the wider community.

Organisations that can apply:

- Schools or colleges
- Youth centres
- Libraries/museums/archives (via the schools)
- Community groups

We offer: small grants of up to £500 to groups that work with young people both within the traditional education system and those in less formal education settings. Applications should demonstrate input from the young people, e.g. evidence of design input, consultation exercises etc, (rather than the project being solely devised and driven by the staff).

Grants can be spent on such items as:

- Tools and equipment
- Landscaping materials
- Materials for creating cold frames/planters/raised beds
- Top soil/compost
- Seeds, plants, fruit trees/bushes
- Materials for launch of the new/renovated garden to the community (as part of the grant, not the sole reason for the grant).

Examples of items that will not be funded:

- BBQ's
- Patio heaters
- Benches
- Pre-completed hanging baskets or other already planted items
- Items that can be obtained from other sources e.g. small plastic pots

In return those awarded a grant agree to provide the following feedback:-

- Complete a simple evaluation report,
- Provide receipts for items purchased,
- Produce a file of evidence showing progress of the project to include such things as before, during and after photos, video diary, student blog, press cuttings etc. This file can be burnt onto DVD.

Groups will have 12 months from the date of the award in which to utilize the funds, otherwise funds will have to be returned. If you find yourselves unable to spend the funds within the given time period the Trust may exceptionally grant an extension.

Please acknowledge the help of the Cornwall Gardens Trust in any publicity your project receives.

Don't forget that this grant may encourage other organisations to help you. Therefore, consider approaching your local town/village council, Chamber of Trade, Rotary Club, local gardening club or allotment group.
